Dear Madame Vice President,

With Election Day one week away, there are serious lingering concerns among millions of Christian voters about your commitment to protecting innocent life, families, and religious liberty. These worries are compounded by your campaign's preference for vague platitudes versus clear policy prescriptions, especially on social and cultural issues, as well as your [recently stated objection](#) to considering long-respected accommodations for religious citizens in making new law. The American people deserve answers to the following questions right away:

1. In your recent [interview with NBC News](#), you indicated no policy concessions would be made by your administration in pursuit of a national abortion law to “put back in the protections of *Roe v Wade*,” including no religious exemptions or conscience protections. Should Catholic hospitals, Christian charities, and ministries such as Little Sisters of the Poor prepare for federal pressure under a Harris presidency?
2. Would religious liberty and parental rights be subordinated by other items on your agenda—for example, the promotion of so-called “gender-affirming” procedures, especially for minors?
3. At precisely what week of pregnancy do you consider it no longer permissible to end the life of a baby in the womb? You recently [denied](#) the possibility that late-term abortions up until the ninth month could occur under your presidency, yet countless American women are in fact currently experiencing them to the detriment of their short and [long-term health](#).
4. Is there any circumstance under which a Harris administration would support a six-week abortion limit – like those in [South Carolina, Florida, and elsewhere](#) – to protect unborn children following detection of a [heartbeat](#)? If there are any exceptions or provisions that would make a difference in your support or opposition, please outline them.
5. If not at six weeks, then would your administration be in favor of protecting the unborn at 15 weeks' gestation, the point at which science shows that children can [feel](#) the sharp pain of abortion? An overwhelming [majority](#) of Americans supports such a protection. Yet not once, but twice, as a U.S. senator you [voted](#) against commonsense legislation that would have protected the lives of children after 20 weeks' gestation, with reasonable exceptions for the mother's life.

6. You have voiced support for the so-called Women’s Health Protection Act, legislation intended to impose all-trimester abortion without limits on all 50 states, taking access to abortion far beyond even what *Roe v. Wade* allowed. Former President Bill Clinton previously insisted that abortion be “[safe, legal and rare](#),” and former President Barack Obama [said in 2008](#) that he thinks “it’s entirely appropriate for states to restrict or even prohibit late-term abortions as long as there is a strict, well-defined exception for the health of the mother.” Both Clinton and Obama have campaigned for you. Do you believe they are wrong?
7. As a U.S. senator, you voted [against](#) bipartisan legislation to ensure that children who survive an abortion receive the same level of medical care as any other child born into a mother’s arms at the same gestational age. Is this something you still oppose?
8. Millions of women have received aid and resources from our country’s robust network of nearly [3,000 pregnancy resource centers](#) (PRCs). Would they still be able to access such holistic care under a Harris presidency? As Vice President, you [praised](#) efforts by Democratic attorneys general to shut down these centers and stop them from providing physical, emotional, and spiritual support to expecting mothers in need. Just as troubling, your running mate Tim Walz’s record as Minnesota’s governor is no better, as he recently [terminated](#) a nearly 20-year-old state program that provided more than \$3 million to support the healing work of PRCs each year.
9. You were the first-ever sitting U.S. vice president to [visit](#) a Planned Parenthood facility, known for terminating the life of one baby every [80 seconds](#) nationwide. Do you have any plans to also visit a pregnancy resource center to learn more about the work they do to save babies and serve women and families?
10. In January 2023, [you omitted](#) the words “right to life” as guaranteed by our Creator in your recitation of the Declaration of Independence at an event celebrating the 50th anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*. You also omitted the word “Creator.” Do you believe, as our Founders believed, and as former President John F. Kennedy [once put it](#), “that the rights of man come not from the generosity of the state but from the hand of God”? And if so, do you believe life to be among our God-given human rights?

American voters deserve a swift response to these pressing questions affecting our families and faith. We at the Faith & Freedom Coalition ask the Harris-Walz campaign to clearly articulate its positions on each item above to provide Americans with full transparency before Election Day.
